Called to Bar, Lincoln's Inn, 1895, and practised mainly in educational and charity cases; Examiner in Law, London University. Served on London County Council as a Municipal Reformer, East Islington, 1907-10. Director or Chairman of Sothebys 1909-28. In the War he raised the five Salford Battalions. K.B.E. 1918.

He was started on Conservative politics by his father's example, by debating at Repton and at the Cambridge Union, influenced by Macaulay's <u>Essays</u> at School and Pericles' great speech in the 2nd Book of Thucydides; and he read The Times. Sir Montagu is a strong upholder of Christianity and the Church of England. As he had a good income and was a bachelor, Parliament seemed natural and interesting; he was put in touch with three constituencies in 1909 and selected the Salford seat. His elections cost £800 to £900 and £500 a year; and on joining the Government he had to give up directorships. He got a baronetcy on leaving the Cabinet, 1924.

He enjoyed most, unlike anybody else, his close relations with his constituents, and promoting unemployment insurance while in office. He liked best his first speech as Minister of Labour, "on which I received the public congratulations of the Leader of the Opposition, Mr H.H. Asquith." And his best piece of work, apart from his services as Minister and Parl. Sec., was securing a suitable and unanimous report from the

Select Committee on Pension Scales and Administration over which he presided.
